Subject: Legislative Update

Below is a list of two-year bills and those bills that have been introduced so far in 2012. As you will note, a number of the two-year bills from last year have failed the “house of origin” deadline and are essentially dead for the year. We provide some of them in this report as an update, but will remove them on future reports which will focus on the bills that have been introduced this year. The deadline to introduce new bills is February 24<sup>th</sup>. Leading up to this deadline we will be reviewing introduced and amended bills daily and flagging those with impacts on your departments. The CPPCA Legislative Committee will be meeting on March 7<sup>th</sup> to review and recommend positions on all introduced bills.

**TITLE:** Juvenile Offenders: Recall of Commitment

**LAST AMEND:** 02/07/2012

**FILE:** 2

**LOCATION:** Senate Second Reading File

**SUMMARY:** Expands the class of persons who may be committed to the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Division of Juvenile Facilities to include a ward who has been committed a specified sex offense, or who was previously found to have committed a specified serious or violent offense or a specified sex offense. Authorizes the Divisions Chief to enter into contracts with counties to provide housing to a ward whose commitment was recalled under specified circumstances.

**TITLE:** Sentencing: Three Strikes

**LAST AMEND:** 01/26/2012

**LOCATION:** SENATE

**SUMMARY:** Relates to the Three Strikes law. Provides that a defendant who has 2 or more

prior violent or serious felony convictions shall receive an enhanced indeterminate life sentence only if the defendant's current conviction is for a serious or violent felony. Provides that this measure would become effective only when submitted to, and approved by, the voters at the November, 2014, statewide general election.

**TITLE:** Registered Sex Offenders: Community Care Facilities  
**LAST AMEND:** 01/04/2012  
**LOCATION:** Senate Human Services Committee  
**SUMMARY:** Prohibits a person required to register under the Sex Offender Registration Act from residing, working, or volunteering in specified homes or facilities licensed by the State Department of Social Services or a county child welfare services agency. Sets forth requirements for specified officials who register a person under the Act. Requires the State Department of Social Services to provide specified information concerning certain homes or facilities that service children.

**TITLE:** Graffiti Offenses: Fine: Drivers License: Suspension  
**LAST AMEND:** 01/04/2012  
**LOCATION:** ASSEMBLY  
**SUMMARY:** Requires the court to impose an additional graffiti abatement program fine for deposit into the Graffiti Abatement Program Fund. Requires the moneys in the fund to be allocated to city and county programs in proportion to the number of convictions. Revises the provisions that govern the exception for the suspension of a person's privilege to driver upon a graffiti violation conviction.

**TITLE:** Delinquency and Gang Intervention Grants  
**LAST AMEND:** 01/04/2012  
**LOCATION:** SENATE  
**SUMMARY:** Requires the Board of State and Community Corrections to identify the

delinquency and gang intervention and prevention grant funds and programs for the purpose of consolidating those grants and programs and moving toward a unified single grant application process. Requires the development of grant incentives. Requires the board to develop a plan to ensure a specified percentage of the related funds are used in specified juvenile justice programs with evidence-based practices.

**TITLE:** Domestic Violence: Battering: Recall and Resentencing  
**LAST AMEND:** 01/05/2012  
**LOCATION:** SENATE

**SUMMARY:** Makes the provisions for a writ of habeas corpus based on an intimate partner battering operative indefinitely. Provides that such writ may also be prosecuted if expert testimony relating to intimate partner battering and its effects was received into evidence but was limited at the trial court proceeding to due specified circumstances.

**TITLE:** Sex Offender Registration  
**LAST AMEND:** 01/26/2012  
**LOCATION:** ASSEMBLY

**SUMMARY:** Establishes 4-tiers of sex offender registration based on specified criteria for specified time periods and a fourth tier of registration, known as inactive registration, that would include a person who does not come within the other 3 tiers and who is required to reregister during his or her lifetime only if he or she changes his or her address. Requires that, by a specified date, a tier level be assigned to every registered sex offender, except a person who has not registered after a specified date.

Requires a person required under the Sex Offender Registration Act to register his or her Internet accounts and Internet identifiers. Requires the Department of Justice to release information regarding the relevant Internet accounts and identifiers to entities that provide social networking services on the Internet. Requires, as conditions of probation or parole, that a person required to register as a sex offender be prohibited from using the Internet except as provided.

**LAST AMEND:** 01/04/2012

**LOCATION:** ASSEMBLY

**SUMMARY:**

Provides that a person who was adjudicated a ward of the court for the commission of a violation of specified provisions prohibiting prostitution may petition a court to have his or her records sealed as pertains to the prostitution offenses without showing that he or she has not been subsequently convicted of a felony or misdemeanor involving moral turpitude, or that rehabilitation has been attained.

**SUMMARY:**

Amends existing law which provides that no person shall use, or be under the influence of, specified controlled substances and provides the punishment for person found guilty, and the provisions of an proposition that allows the court to grant probation with a drug treatment condition for a conviction of a nonviolent drug possession offense. Deletes the provisions requiring incarceration for a conviction of unlawfully using or being under the influence.

**SUMMARY:** Provides a revision of the Public Employees Retirement Law to include an school member payrate, the request for a new amortization period by a contracting agency or school employer, budget-related contribution rates, funds to reduce the employer contribution for patrol members, trial court member furlough credit, patrol member retirement formulas, a limited duration appointment of a retiree, retiree interim or temporary appointments, the appointment of a disabled retiree, and death benefits.

Makes an act or omission relating to approval of the batterer's treatment programs a discretionary act.

**LOCATION:** Senate Appropriations Committee  
**SUMMARY:** Provides it is a misdemeanor for any retail distributor to sell or distribute specified amounts of nonprescription products containing ephedrine or related substances within specified time limits, sell to a person whose information has generated an alert, or sell a nonprescription product containing any amount of those substances. Requires submission of sales information to the National Precursor Log Exchange. Requires the system to be available to the Department of Justice and law enforcement at no charge.

**LOCATION:** SENATE

**SUMMARY:** Relates to parking offenses. Relates to delinquent payments made by counties. Requires the Controller to calculate the interest on such payments. Revises the formula for calculating the penalty. Requires a county, city and county, or court to pay the interest or penalty amounts to the State Court Facilities Construction Fund. Authorizes the Controller to permit those entities to pay the interest penalty under a payment schedule. Requires the payment to be made by the entity responsible for the error.

### CA AB 1301

**TITLE:** Retail Tobacco Sales: STAKE Act

**LAST AMEND:** 01/18/2012

**LOCATION:** Senate Health Committee

**SUMMARY:** Amends the the Stop Tobacco Access to Kids Enforcement Act. Removes the schedule for State Board of Equalization action in response to the occurrence of a violation of the Act or the related misdemeanor provision. Requires the board to suspend or revoke a retailer's license for subsequent violations. Requires the assessment of an additional civil penalty to be deposited in the existing Cigarette and Tobacco Products Compliance Fund to fund suspension and revocation activities.

**SUMMARY:** Provides that a parent or guardian of a child under 14 years of age who knowingly fails to report to law enforcement within 24 hours that the child has died when the

death occurred under circumstances that would cause a reasonable person to believe that the death was a result of a crime, or that the child has disappeared under circumstances that would lead to a reasonable person to believe the child is in danger of physical harm, is guilty of a felony.

**SUMMARY:** Adds employees of a public or private institution of higher education, concerning child abuse or neglect occurring on that institution's premises, to the list of individuals who are mandated child abuse reporters.

---

### [CA AB 1438](#)

**AUTHOR:** Bradford (D)  
**TITLE:** Child Abuse Reporting  
**LAST AMEND:** 01/23/2012  
**LOCATION:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**SUMMARY:** Requires any person to report to a peace officer a known or suspected instance of a child being the victim of sexual abuse. Makes a failure to report punishable by imprisonment in a county jail or a fine or both.

### [CA AB 1440](#)

**AUTHOR:** Perea (D)  
**TITLE:** Child Abuse and Neglect: Reports  
**LOCATION:** Assembly Human Services Committee  
**SUMMARY:** Requires each county child welfare agency to review a child's death and prepare a written report containing specified information. Requires the county agency to submit this report to the State Department of Social Services.

Requires the board to maintain a record of a member's compliance and to post the policy and an annual report on member compliance on the system's Internet Web site.

**SUMMARY:** Amends existing law which provides that when a spouse is convicted of attempting to murder the other spouse or of soliciting the murder of the other spouse, the injured spouse shall be entitled to 100% of the community property interest in his or her retirement and pension benefits, and a prohibition of specified support or insurance benefits from the injured spouse to the convicted spouse.

**TITLE:** Firearm Possession  
**LOCATION:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**SUMMARY:** Amends existing law which prohibits a person from possessing a firearm in a school zone. Exempts a security guard and an honorably retired peace officer from that prohibition. Recasts provisions by removing stipulation of incorporated cities or current prohibitions in specified unincorporated areas to make it an offense for a person to carry a loaded firearm on his or her person or in a vehicle in any public place or on any public street.

### CA AB 1528

**TITLE:** Disorderly Conduct: Invasion of Privacy: Felony  
**LOCATION:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**SUMMARY:** Amends existing law establishing the offense of disorderly conduct that includes specified invasions of privacy. Makes specified invasion of privacy offenses a felony punishable by imprisonment in a state prison.

### CA AB 1529

**TITLE:** Trial Courts: Restructuring and Bail Forfeiture  
**LOCATION:** Assembly Judiciary Committee  
**SUMMARY:** Modifies provisions of law to reflect trial court restructuring. Deletes obsolete references to municipal court. Specifies the jurisdiction of a writ petition relating to a small claims case. Revises various provisions to reflect the state's responsibility for trial court funding, including jury fees, expert witnesses, interpreters, and translators.

**SUMMARY:** Provides no insurer shall, in issuing or renewing a private automobile insurance policy to a peace officer, member of the Department of the State Highway Patrol, or firefighter, with respect to his or her operation of a private passenger motor vehicle, increase the premium on that policy for the reason that the insured or applicant for insurance has been involved in an accident while operating his or her private passenger motor vehicle in the performance of his or her duty. Relates to accident reporting.

**SUMMARY:** Exempts persons who are licensed and engaged in the business of manufacturing ammunition from the prohibitions and requirements regarding the carrying, concealing, selling, transferring or delivering, any handgun concealed upon his or her person or concealed within any vehicle under his or her control. Exempts such manufacturers from law against openly carrying an unloaded handgun if the handgun is merchandise. Exempts persons with specified credentials from obtaining a verification upon a firearm transfer.

Requires employers to provide training in child abuse and neglect identification. Requires the Franchise Tax Board to revoke the exemption of an organization if a person who is a mandated reporter has been found guilty of failure to report an incident of known or reasonably suspected child sexual abuse.

**SUMMARY:** Makes it a felony to intentionally engage in the smuggling of a human being for profit or commercial purpose. Makes it a felony if a person being smuggled is under 18 years of age and is not accompanied by a family member over 18 years of age, or the offense involves the use of a weapon designed for lethal use.

**TITLE:** School Attendance: Residency Requirements: Foster Child  
**LOCATION:** Assembly Education Committee  
**SUMMARY:** Deems a pupil who is a foster child and who remains in his or her school of origin, to have met the residency requirements for school attendance in that school district.

**TITLE:** Parolee: Driver's Licenses  
**LOCATION:** ASSEMBLY  
**SUMMARY:** Requires the Department of Motor Vehicles, the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation and county jails to adopt rules and enter into interagency agreements necessary to establish the identities of offenders for the purposes of assisting offenders in obtaining a driver's license or identification card

### CA AB 1604

**TITLE:** Invasion of Privacy: Computer Crimes  
**LOCATION:** ASSEMBLY  
**SUMMARY:** Authorizes a person to intercept the wire or electronic transmissions of a computer trespasser, if specified conditions are met, including authorization by the owner or operator of the computer system and being engaged in an investigation.

---

### CA AB 1628

**AUTHOR:** Beall (D)  
**TITLE:** Child Abuse Reporting  
**LOCATION:** ASSEMBLY  
**SUMMARY:** Makes technical, nonsubstantive changes to the Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act requiring a mandated reporter to report whenever he or she in his or her professional capacity or within the scope of his or her employment, has knowledge of or observed a child whom the mandated reporter knows or reasonably suspects has been the victim of child abuse or neglect.

### CA AB 1633

**AUTHOR:** Wagner (R)  
**TITLE:** Public Employees' Retirement

**SUMMARY:** Applies the post government employment restrictions of the Political Reform Act of 1974 to other public officials serving as members of local governing boards or commissions with decision making authority.

**TITLE:** Public Employees: Pensions: Forfeiture

**LAST AMEND:** 01/04/2012

**LOCATION:** SENATE

**SUMMARY:** Requires a public officer or employee who is convicted of any felony for specified criminal activity arising directly out of that person's official duties to forfeit all rights and benefits under, and membership in, any public retirement system in which they are a member, effective on the conviction date. Requires the employee contributions to be returned to the employee without interest. Requires a separate account to maintain the innocent spouse's community property interest in any benefits accrued.

**LAST AMEND:** 01/04/2012

**LOCATION:** ASSEMBLY

**SUMMARY:** Amends an existing law that requires the driver of a vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injury to another person or death to stop the vehicle at the scene and provide certain information to a traffic or police officer. Enacts the Joshua Lacy Law. Requires the prosecution of an offense punishable by imprisonment to commence within a specified number of years.

Requires the agency with jurisdiction over the confined person to determine whether that person has committed a sexually violent offense. Provides rights of the accused in the process.
